- 1. Call to order: Courtney Derouin calls to order at 6:02PM

- 4. Principal Report by Kendra Thompson
 - Thank you for attending Christmas Fringe
 - i Lots of families came
 - ii Lots of positive feedback from parents in the hallway as they were attending it during the day
 - iii Will be sending a mid year survey in the upcoming weeks
 - Pre-K and Kindergarten Expo:
 - i Division at Four Winds on January 17th from 6-7:30 PM
 - EMPS Pre-K and Kindergarten Open House will be on February 22nd from 6-7:30
 PM- confirmed today will put out in Dragon News this week
 - 1 Presentation on what is provided here
 - 2 EMPS swag bags- welcome to our school
 - Reminders regarding cold weather
 - i Indoor recesses occur at -25 with wind chill using The Weather Network

- ii Reminder there is no outside supervision until 8:35 AM (Admin procedure 255). Doors open at 8:35 AM
- Bus Cancellation Admin Procedure 320
 - i School bus service may be suspended at a temperature of minus forty (40) degrees Celsius, as determined by the Weather Network at Bon Accord, AB., or as articulated in 2.4.1. Other contributing factors include:
 - 1 Visibility under 1km or impassable roads;
 - 2 Reports from bus drivers, counties or municipalities concerning the conditions of rural roads;
 - 3 Notification of severe weather provided by Alberta Emergency Alert and or;

 - 1 Feedback- if there is dates available, would like to change to Edge
- Budget Update:
 - i Resource allocation: 32.54 FTE staff- includes all teachers, counsellor, and school administration
 - ii Support Services: 34.6 FTE support staff-
 - 1 Pulled out staff employed by Jordan's Principle:
 - a Federal funded program where students who are status and on reserve, their families can apply to get the funds needed to support them
 - b School can apply to get extra funding to support these students
 - c Funding is temporary and is year to year
 - d From Norway House Cree: Jordan River Anderson
 - e Federal funding into provincial establishments- supposed to alleviate barriers between federal vs provincial funding so that kids can get the support they need

- f Every EA funded with this is 1:1 with the one student that we applied with for the grant- so EA needs to support that student
- g Federal funding that we applied for that particular student so that they don't fall through the cracks
- h If that child switches schools/switches divisions, the EA leaves with them. Funding for a student support
- iii Basic Program Allocation Per Student: \$100, 851
- iv Nutrition program: \$91, 500 (increase from last year)
- v Operational Carry Forward: no budget leftover to carry from last year
- vi School Generated Carry Forward: \$6407 (is carried forward for multiple years)
- vii Will continue to share the budget 2 more times this year
- viii Working through the new curriculum and funding the appropriate resources for same

 - Grade 1s are doing literacy and numeracy screeners
 - Chickens are doing well
 - i Any extra eggs are being donated to Jesse's House
 - ii 1 dozen every 2 weeks

 - Counselling and Wellness Plan:
 - Revisited and re-tweaked each year
 - o On EMPS website
 - Top half is Sturgeon Public Schools which is applicable to all schools
 - Further down is more specific to EMPS
 - Supports/Interventions
 - Who we are focusing on and how we are ensuring to support all students in our school
 - Focus: what goal we are trying to achieve
 - Examples: how we are working towards achieving it
 - Left column is more generalized to all students and becomes more individualized as you move columns to the right
 - Communication plan:
 - How we are communicating it
 - Aimee Diewert is the Mental Health Wellness Coach
 - Theme:

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- What we are working on for the month
- Teachers can address this in the classroom
- When Aimee goes into the classroom, addresses the same
- Assembly at the end of the month
- Students are nominated for the theme
- Ensuring that each student is nominated once for the theme throughout the year so everyone is included

- Roots of Empathy
 - Anti-bullying program
- Other programs:
 - Incredible Flexible You
 - Dandelion Club: military children
 - Candy Cane community fundraiser raised over \$500
- o Group counselling, self esteem, anxiety is year round
- No name calling week is next week

- Outside supports we can access outside of our resources if needing specialized areas
 - Ex. First Nation, Metis, & Inuit (Jerome Chabot)
 - Deaf and Hard of Hearing/Blind and Low Vision referrals can be done
- School Councillor is not a one on one providing therapy to your children, it's about making connections and networking to reach out and support children appropriately, providing a safe place and point of contact for kids (assistance now) and can establish a relationship and then reach out and network out to get them the supports they need

 - i Coming out in the next couple of months
